



X Annual Report Pursuant to Article 18(8) of the European Media Freedom Act – August 2026

This Annual Transparency Report is published by X pursuant to Article 18(8) of the European Media Freedom Act (“EMFA”). It provides certain information in relation to the content and declarations provided by media service providers (“MSPs”) during the first reporting period.

Introduction

X reflects real-world conversations, including perspectives that some may find offensive or controversial. X's purpose is to serve the public conversation. Violence, harassment, and other similar types of behaviour discourage people from expressing themselves, and ultimately diminish the value of global public conversation. The [X Rules](#) are in place to help ensure everyone feels safe expressing their beliefs and we strive to enforce them with uniform consistency. When it comes to enforcing these rules, we are committed to being fair, informative, responsive, and accountable.

We have a global team that manages enforcement of the [X Terms of Service](#) and our Rules with 24/7 coverage. Our goal is to apply the X Rules objectively and consistently. Enforcement actions are taken on content that is determined to violate the X Rules.

Under EMFA, MSPs that meet the prescribed transparency and independence requirements may have certain additional protections when their content is moderated by platforms like ours for violations of the platform's terms and conditions (*)¹. ¹ (*) Such additional protections are not applicable when content moderation actions are taken to comply with our obligations relating to illegal content pursuant to Union law, our obligations pursuant to Articles 28, 34 and 35 of the Digital Services Act and or our Article 28b of the Audiovisual Media Services Directive, transposed into Irish law by the Online Safety and Media Regulation Act and the Online Safety Code published by Coimisiún na Meán.

1. Restrictions or suspensions imposed on declared MSPs:

X did not impose any relevant restrictions or suspensions in relation to content provided by declared MSPs during the reporting period.

2. Dialogues with declared MSPs

X did not have any dialogues with declared MSPs pursuant to Article 18(6) EMFA during the reporting period.

3. Rejections of declarations:

During the reporting period, X rejected 29 declarations submitted by MSPs pursuant to Article 18 of EMFA.
